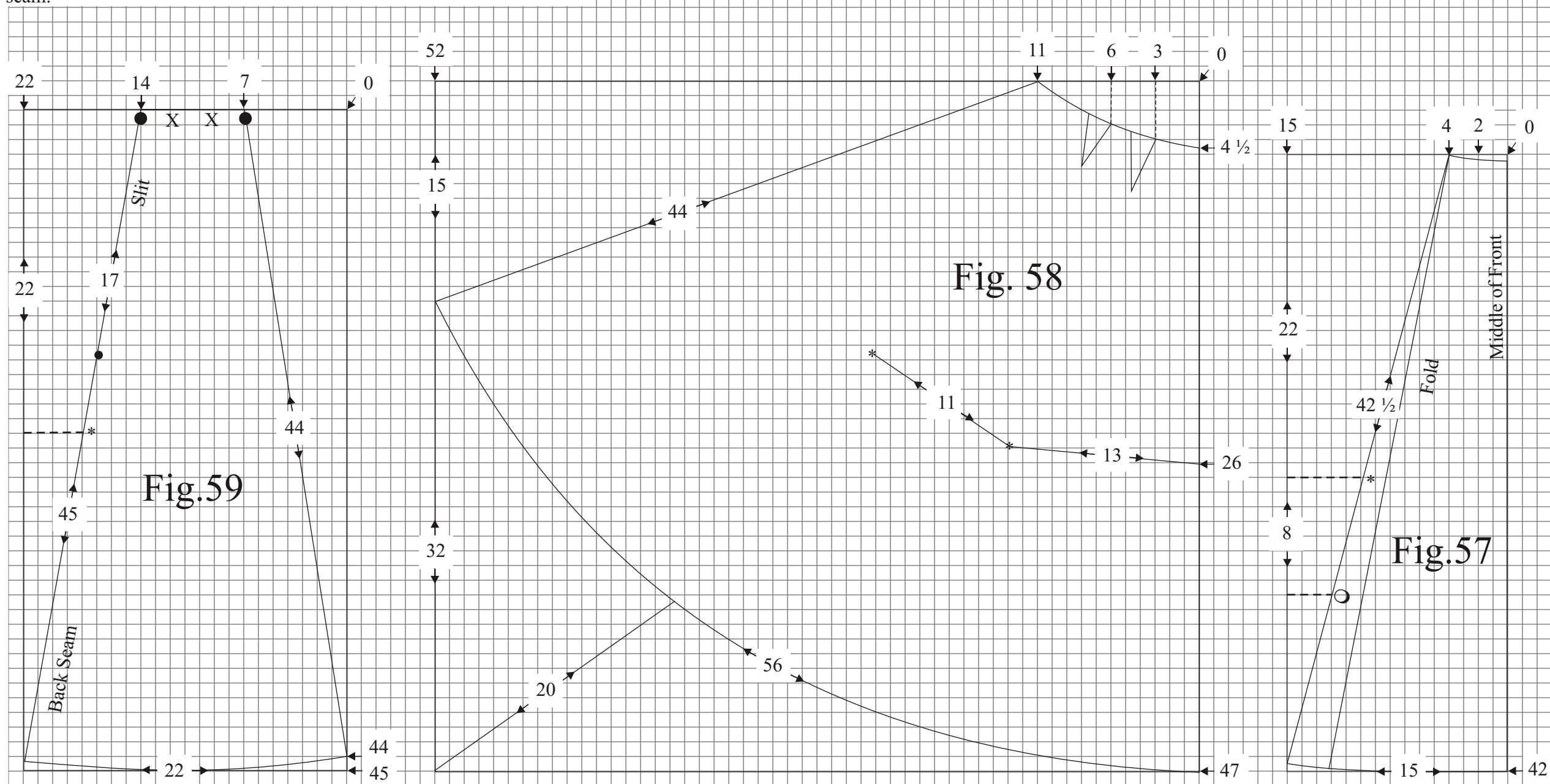
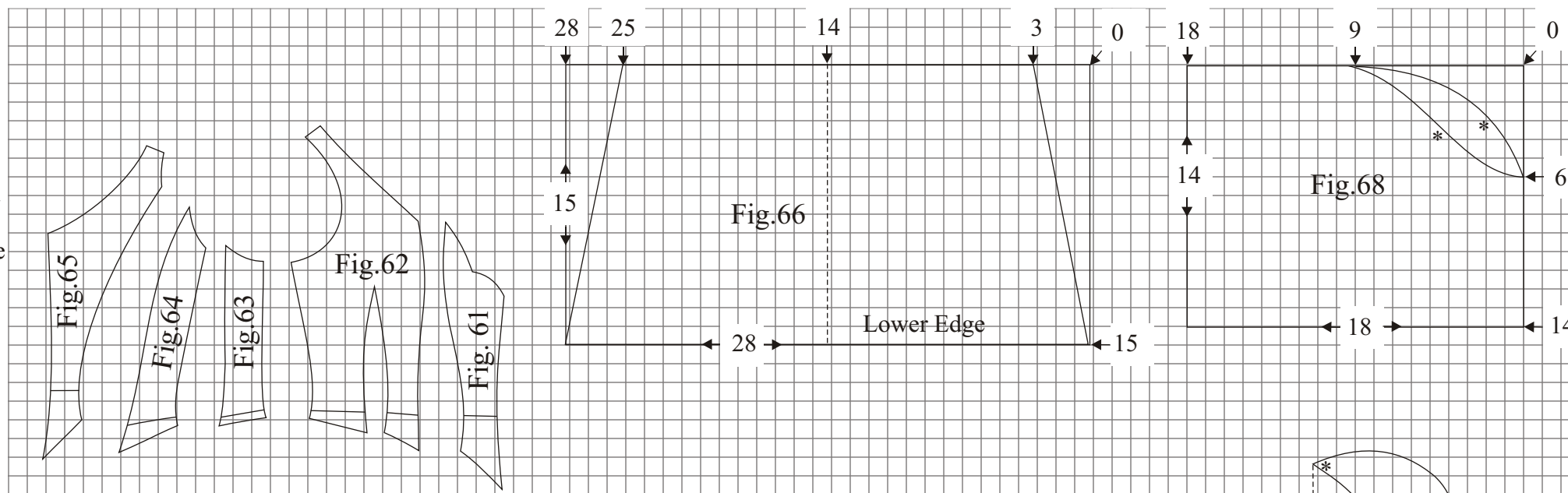


Velvet Gown With Embroidered Waist

The skirt pattern is given in Figs. 57-59, with the full dimensions in inches marked on it. It is five yards and three-quarters wide, and is in five gored breadths, a front which is folded in toward the bottom to form a broad pleat, a wide side breadth, and two godet back breadths. The back breadths are each pleated in a box-pleat formed by bringing x's to ●'s; the sides are darted. The pleat in the front is held by two straps crossing it inside at the points ○; the points * are tacked to a strap which passes around the back. The skirt is interlined about half its depth at the bottom.

The pattern of the waist is given in Figs. 61-68. Join the parts according to corresponding figures. Fig. 67 is the silk sleeve lining, and Fig. 68 gives the shape and size of the chiffon puff. For the drape about the neck cut two pieces as indicated in Fig. 66, and set gathered lace at the lower edge; shirr the middle shirring about an inch in front of the shoulder seam.



Material: 11 yards of velvet.
Bust measure, 36 inches
Waist measure, 26 inches
