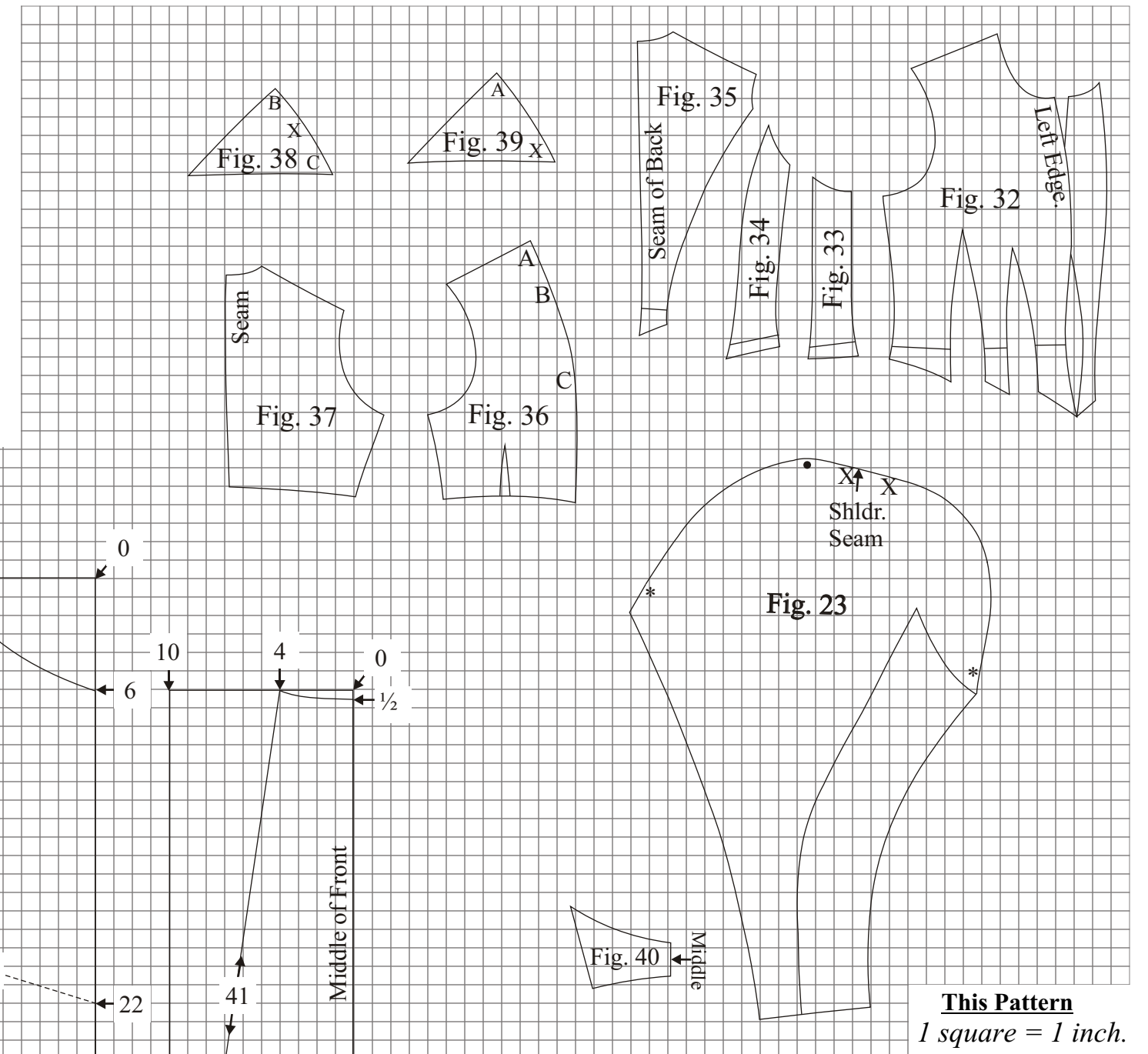
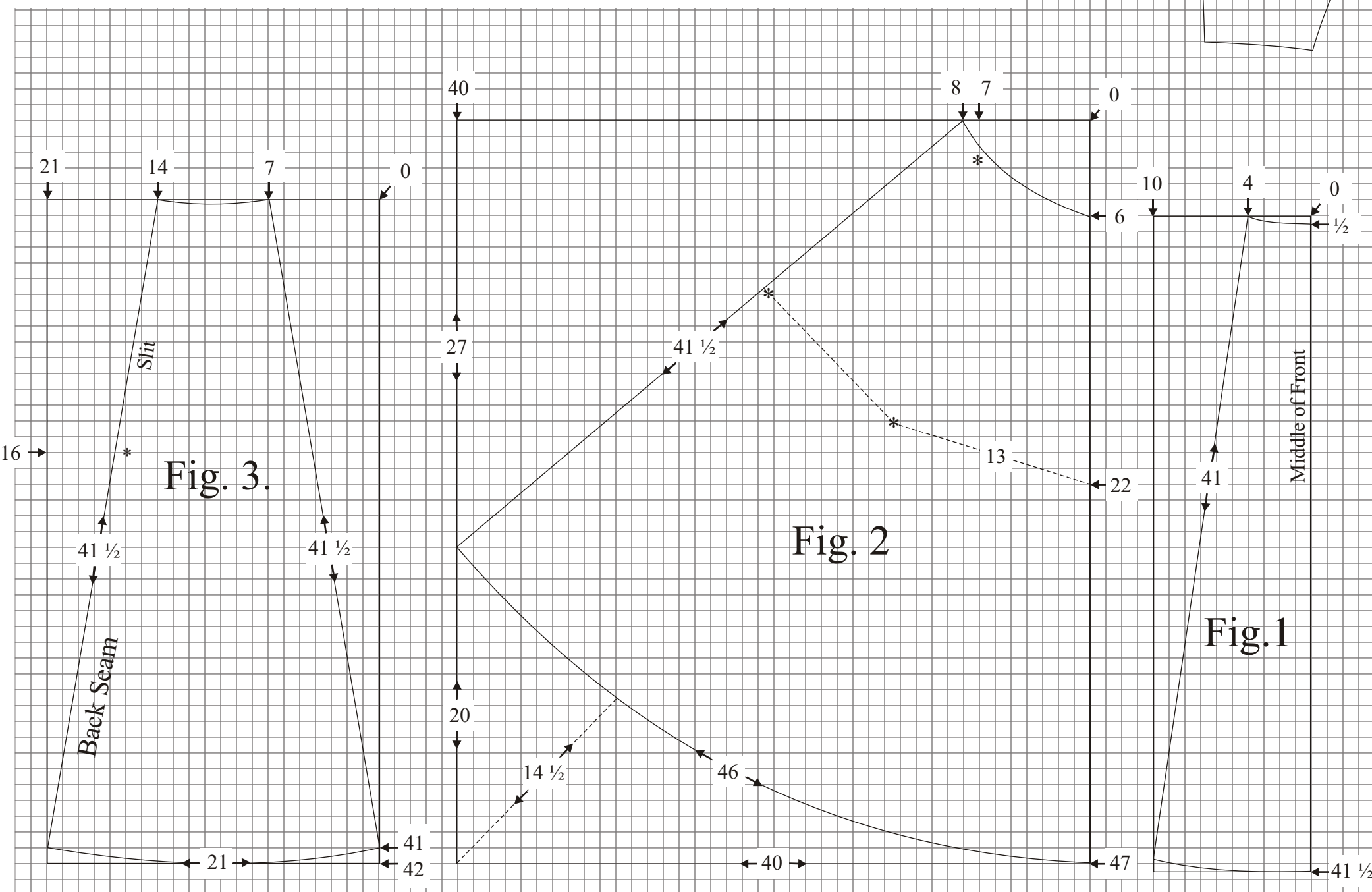


# COSTUME WITH BOLERO AND VELVET VEST

from Harper's Bazar February 13, 1897

The skirt, given in Figs. 1-3, is in five gored breadths, and is four yards and a quarter wide; it is lined with percaline and interlined twelve inches deep with hair-cloth. The back is gathered from \* to the slit; the points \* lower down are tacked upon an elastic strap. Cut the vest of velvet and lining according to Figs. 32-35; take up the darts, and join fronts, side forms, and back, leaving the shoulder seams open for the jacket. Set hooks and eyes down the middle of the front, button the left edge over, and set a row of buttons to correspond on the right side. Cut the jacket from Figs. 36 and 37; take up the small dart in the front of the lining only. Join the sides, baste on the vest, and join the shoulder seam. Cut the sleeves from Fig. 23; fit the front very closely, and finish with the cuff. Fig. 40. The pattern of the revers is given in Figs. 38 and 39.



**Material:** 6 yards of 48-inch cloth, 2 yards of velvet.  
**Bust Measure,** 37 inches. **Waist measure,** 25 inches.
